

## Anna TRIANDAFYLLIDOU

**Professor Anna Triandafyllidou** heads the Research Area on *Cultural Pluralism* at the Global Governance Programme of the **European University Institute (Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies)**.



She is also a **Visiting Professor at the College of Europe** in Bruges, Belgium, since 2002; and the **Editor-in-Chief** of the *Journal of Immigrant and Refugee Studies*, since 2013.

She is a member of the **Board of Directors**, and **Chair** of the **Editorial Committee** of the *IMISCOE Network* which brings together over **30 Universities and Research Centres** across Europe on issues of **International Migration and Social Cohesion in Europe**.

### Past Positions

Professor Triandafyllidou received her Ph.D. from the EUI in 1995. She conducted research as a post-doctoral fellow at the University of Surrey (1994-95), and then won the prestigious **T H Marshall Fellowship at the London School of Economics** (1995-97). In 1997 she obtained a highly competitive **Marie Curie Fellowship** at the Italian National Research Council (CNR) in Rome (1997-99). She continued her work as a **Jean Monnet Fellow at the European University Institute** in Florence, Italy (1999-2000) and **Project Director** (2000-2004). During this time she spent a semester at **New York University** as **Fulbright Scholar in Residence** (2001), and 2 months at the **University of Bristol** as **Colston Fellow** (2001-2002).

She went back to Athens, Greece in 2004 to take up a position as **Senior Research Fellow** and Coordinator of the then nascent Migration Research Area, at the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP). In the 8 years that she stayed in ELIAMEP she built a **strong migration research team**, and raised over 5 million Euro in funding for research. She was also appointed as **tenured Ass. Professor at the Democritus University of Thrace** in Greece in 2007. In 2010 she was offered a **Part Time Professorship** at the Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies at the European University Institute in Florence Italy developing work on migrant and minority integration, migrants and the media and circular migration. In 2012 she won her current position as **Full Professor** at the European University Institute, Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies. As part of her current appointment she has mentored 22 post doctoral and mid-career fellows and co-supervised or examined 15 doctoral students.

### Other Professional Roles

She serves as **national expert in the OECD Network of International Migration Experts** (formerly SOPEMI) since 2010, and acts as **scientific evaluator** of research grants for the European Research Council (Advanced / Consolidator / and Starting Grants), the Research Framework Programmes of the European Commission (FP5, FP6, FP7, FP8/Horizon), the ESRC in the UK, the European Science Foundation, the Norface ERA-NET network, and several national research agencies (of Austria, Belgium, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Italy, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Sweden and Switzerland).

She has been invited to give **keynote speeches** in Europe and the USA – including at Trinity College Dublin (June 2010), the German Sociological Association Conference (Bochum, 2012), the ASEN Conference at LSE (April 2016), the International Social Science Council Conference (Oslo, Nov 2016), the Social Sciences and Humanities EU Presidency Conference (Bratislava, Nov 2016), the Brussels Economic Forum (May 2017), COMPAS Oxford University Autumn Academy (Sep 2017), and the Modern Greek Studies Association Conference (Galway, NJ, USA, Nov 2017).

She is a member of the International Advisory Board of *Nations and Nationalism* and a member of the Editorial Board of *Ethnicities*. She reviews book proposals for most major Anglophone social science publishers (Palgrave, Routledge, Ashgate, Oxford University Press, Springer, Amsterdam University Press, Blackwell) and for nearly all the major Anglophone journals in her area of research. She has taught **advanced training courses** for the European Commission, in both English and French. Beyond her native Greek, and English and French, she is fluent in Italian and Spanish and has a basic knowledge of German.

### **Policy Evaluation and Advice**

Anna Triandafyllidou has served as **International Reference Panel member for the Australian government's** Migration Research Programme (2012-2016). She has recently participated as **Senior Evaluator** of the **use and impact of the European Commission's Funds for Migrant Integration** (EIF and AMIF, 2007-2011, 2011-2014 and 2014-today). She has been **consulted by the European Parliament** on the revision of the Blue Card Directive in relation to her book on Circular Migration (OUP, 2011).

### **Innovative Character and Impact of her work**

Professor Triandafyllidou's career has been highly dynamic and international as she has lived and worked in four European countries (Belgium, Greece, Italy and the UK) and in the USA.

Her main areas of research and teaching are **migration, migrant integration, nationalism and globalisation**, from a European and international perspective. Over the past 20 years, she has received funding for **29 international projects**, raising more than 13 million Euro from a variety of sources including the European Commission (Directorate General for Research; DG Employment, DG Home, DG Justice), the International Metropolis Network, the European Science Foundation, the Hellenic Ministry of Culture and Education, and the Open Society Foundations.

She has worked in academic leadership positions both in established world-class institutions like the European University Institute or the London School of Economics and in smaller (but rising) research centres like ELIAMEP in Athens. In all cases she has been a **successful fund raiser and an inspiring team leader** bringing together doctoral students, post-doctoral fellows and more senior researchers from different countries to develop innovative theoretical and policy relevant research in the wider area of immigration and immigrant integration studies. She has taught **undergraduate and MA courses** on migration, nationalism and European integration in the UK, Belgium and Greece, while she has extensive experience in **executive training** for professionals (e.g. EU officers from different Directorates; mid-career diplomats from across Europe, mayors and high level local authority officers). During the last three years she has also developed a Programme of **Massive Open Online Courses** on the Futurelearn Platform (on migration, asylum, cultural diversity, and cities).

Her work on **National Identity and the Other** (1998 article in *Ethnic and Racial Studies*, and research monograph 2001) and her article on the Hierarchy of Greekness (2001, in *Ethnicities*) have inspired a long string of researchers in their study of the interaction between migration and nationalism.

Her work in the project European research project CLANDESTINO concerning **irregular migration** and the related edited volume and journal articles (published in 2009, 2010) have become reference points for European Commission policy documents and academic studies.

Her recent work on **migrant agency and the governance of irregular migration and asylum** (published as a Special Issue in the *European Journal of Migration and Law*, 2017) and her current work on the **complexities of migrant integration today** (published as a Special Issue in the *Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies*, 2017) have become reference points for ongoing research on migrant integration and on migration governance.

Her related policy papers (published in Nov. 2017) on a **sectorial approach to the management of labour migration** have been endorsed by the IOM Researcher Syndicate and put forward to consultations for the

Global Migration Compact. Her paper on **Diversity Partnerships** is endorsed by the World Bank KNOMAD team for the Global Migration Compact.

Her **Handbook on Tolerance and Cultural Diversity** has been used in the training of secondary education teachers across the EU including through the online education programme E-Twinning.
