- 2018 New project - Global Citizenship Law - joins GLOBALCIT under the Global Citizenship research area

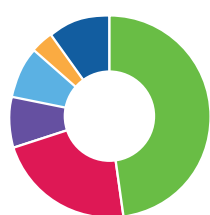
Policy Dialogue
